#### **16 & Under**

**Exhibit Title: "British Isles"** A Front Facing exhibit to the theme British Isles.

The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** complement the theme and be neat and tidy.

Exhibits to be composed of natural material, with or without accessories.

Exhibits to be viewed from the front.

At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

NFYFC will follow the NAFAS Rules on the day of the Finals –This class is foam (oasis) free however eco-friendly and biodegradable alternatives can be used.

#### **21 & Under**

**Exhibit Title: "European City"** A Front Facing Exhibit to theme European City.

The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** complement the theme and be neat and tidy.

At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

Exhibits to be composed of natural material, with or without accessories.

Exhibits to be viewed from the front.

NFYFC will follow the NAFAS Rules on the day of the Finals –This class is foam (oasis) free however eco-friendly and biodegradable alternatives can be used.

## **28 & Under**

**Exhibit Title: “Down Under”** A front facing exhibit to the theme Down Under.

The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** complement the theme and be neat and tidy.

Exhibits to be composed of natural material, with or without accessories.

Exhibits to be viewed from the front.

NFYFC will follow the NAFAS Rules on the day of the Finals –This class is foam (oasis) free however eco-friendly and biodegradable alternatives can be used.

## **DISPLAY**

A worktable will be provided close to the display area – approximately half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor.

Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation.

All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled in the hall.

During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than judges or stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors, will be allowed in the competing area.

At the NFYFC final, the NFYFC will provide a County Name and Number label for each display and workspace.

Competitors may use a battery-operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will no mains power supply available

Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the back board or base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the back board or base board will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit and should be within the size restrictions. The external side of the back board will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit.

Exhibits must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. Any entry removed before the Presentation of Awards will be disqualified.

All exhibits and competitors’ property will be at the risk of the competitor and NFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained – therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

## **TIMING**

Allowance of **one hour to include final checks and measurement of the exhibit**. Before leaving the competing area, competitors will be given a further 5 minutes to clear and tidy the work site.

Competitors may unpack their equipment and plant material/flowers onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session commences.

Competitors may set up their Eco-friendly flower arranging support material/mechanics in position prior to the one-hour practical session if required.

Competitors may set up their display bay before the one-hour practical session commences.

## NFYFC Tug of War - Mens - Ladies - Junior GENSB Team

**Ladies and Men's teams** shall consist of eight pulling members of the same gender. No more than **two (2)** members of a team may be between the ages of 15 and over, and under 17 years on 1 September 2023 and the remainder of the team **MUST** be between 17 years and over, and 28 years of age or under on 1 September 2024.

**A Junior GENSB team** shall consist of between 7 and 10 pulling members, male or female, who must be between 12 years & 17 years of age and under on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2024. **This means competitors MUST have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2024 and may be 18 on the day of the competition.**

All competitors must be full members of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC (**You cannot compete for more than one club and county in one membership year**). Competitors at the National Final must both present their YFC membership card and also, if over 18, have additional official photographic ID (Passport or Driving Licence).

**Coaches and Trainers** – Only one Coach is permitted with each team during pulling. Only one Trainer or "Water-Carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the Trainer shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during actual pulling. Neither the Coach nor Trainer need comply with other rules of eligibility.

**On the day of the NFYFC Final members are only allowed to pull and compete in one age or gender category.**

**To enter a Club Team please let your Club Secretary know you are interested for them to complete and return for the FULL Team. Each club can have 1 Male & Female Team and 2 Junior Teams**

The team can consist of either 2 Senior Members or 2 Inter Members (or mixed) or A Senior or Inter Member driving and a junior navigator.

Each Club can have a maximum of 2 teams.

The competition is to navigate through a marked course not hitting any of the circuit and being timed.

# Morning Competitions

From 9.30 am – 12.30pm

- 1. Senior/Intermediate Tractor - Individual** Competitors must be 17-28 years. Teams of two, the first competitor must manoeuvre a trailer through a course and unhitch. The Second competitor has to attach linkage implement and manoeuvre through course.to finish. The course will be designed by the judge and will not be judged on timing but skill. Judges results are final.
- 2. Junior Tractor – Individual** Competitors must be 14 – 17 years and are required to negotiate a course set by the judge and will not be judged on timing but skill. Judges results are final.
- 3. ATV – Inter/Senior Team** A team shall consist of two members, one shall be 21 years or under on the 1st of September 2024 and the other member shall be 28 years or under on the 1st September 2024. The course will be set by the judge and will not be judged on timing but skill. Judges results are final.
- 4. ATV – Junior Team** a team shall consist of two Junior members, both must be aged between 14-17 years of age on the 1st of September 2024. The course will be set by the judge and will not be judged on timing but skill. Judges results are final.
- 5. Mini Digger Tyre - Open Individual for 14 & Above only** – judged by quickest time to get 5 balls in a tyre/Bucket.
- 6. Wind up Ratchet strap – Open Individual** Competitors must be 10 – 28 years. Judged by quickest time and the neatest.
- 7. Dress and Undress a farmer's outfit – Open Individual** Judged by quickest time and preciseness of clothing.
- 8. How many Rich Tea Biscuits can you eat in a minute without water – Open Individual** Competitors must be 10 – 28 years. Judged by quickest time.
- 9. Nail bashing – Open Individual** Competitors must be 10 – 28 years. Judged by amount of hits in a certain time.
- 10. Welly Wanging – Open Individual** Competitors must be 10 – 28 years. judged by furthest distance thrown.
- 11. Change a Double Duvet & Two Pillows – Open Individual** Competitors must be 10-28 years. Judged by quickest time.
- 12. Splat the Rat – Open Individual** Competitors must be 10-28 years. Judged by amount of times hit in 30 seconds
- 13. Hoopla – Open Individual** Competitors must be 10-28 years. Judged by amount in within a certain amount of time.

Oven Temp 180°/350°F/ Gas Mark 4

- 100g (4oz) Butter, Softened
- 175g (6oz) Caster Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 2 Ripe Bananas, Mashed
- 225g (8oz) Self-Raising Flour
- 1 Teaspoon Baking Powder
- 2 Tablespoons Milk
- Gas Mark 4



### Method

Lightly grease tin and line with non-stick baking parchment. Measure all the ingredients into a mixing bowl and beat for about 2 minutes, until well blended. Spoon the mixture into the tin and level the surface. Bake for about 1 hour until well risen and golden brown.

Oven Temp 180°/350°F/ Gas Mark 4

- 250g/9oz
  - 1 tbsp Cocoa Powder
  - 2 tsp Baking Powder
  - 1 tsp Bicarbonate of Soda
  - 250g/9oz Light Muscovado Sugar
  - 200ml/ 1/3 pint Buttermilk
  - 150ml/ 1/4 pint Sunflower Oil
  - 2 tsp Vanilla Extract
  - 1 tbsp Red Food Colouring Gel
  - 2 Large Eggs
- For the icing
- 250g/9oz Butter, Softened
  - 2 tsp Vanilla Extract
  - 300g/10.5oz Icing Sugar
  - 250g/9oz Full-fat Mascarpone



**Method**

Grease tins and line with baking paper. Measure the flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda and sugar into a bowl and mix well. Mix the buttermilk, oil, vanilla, food colouring and 100ml of water in a jug. Add the eggs and whisk until smooth. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and mix until combined. Divide the mixture evenly between the two tins and level surfaces. Bake for about 25-30 mins. Cool in the tins for 10 mins, then leave to cool out of tins on a wire rack.

To make icing, place the soft butter and vanilla extract in a large bowl and sift in half the icing sugar. Mix until smooth. Sift in remaining icing sugar and mix again. Add the mascarpone to the bowl and gently fold in. Assemble cake by spreading the icing between both layers, around the edge and on top.

**Two 20cm/8in Cake tins**

**180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4**

- 50g/2oz Cocoa Powder
- 100g/4oz Muscovado Sugar
- 250ml Boiling Water
- 125g/4.5oz Soft Unsalted Butter
- 150g/5oz Caster Sugar
- 225g/8oz Plain Flour
- ½ tsp Baking Powder
- ½ tsp Bicarbonate of Soda
- 2 tsp Vanilla Extract
- 2 Eggs



**For the Icing:**

- 125ml Water
- 30g/1oz Dark Muscovado Sugar
- 175g/6oz Unsalted Butter
- 300g/10oz Dark Chocolate, Finely Chopped

**Method**

Line the tins with baking parchment and butter the sides. Put the cocoa and dark muscovado sugar into a large bowl and pour in the boiling water. Whisk to mix, then set aside. Cream the butter and caster sugar together in a separate bowl until pale and fluffy. Stir the flour, baking powder, and bicarbonate of soda together in another bowl and set aside. Dribble the vanilla extract into the creamed butter and sugar while mixing, then crack in one egg, then a scoop of the flour mixture, then the second egg. Keep mixing after each addition. Add the rest of the flour mixture little by little, then fold in the cocoa mixture. Divide the batter between the tins and put in the oven for about 30 mins. While the cakes are in the oven start the icing, put the water, muscovado sugar and butter into a pan and melt on a low heat. When the mixture begins to bubble, take the pan off the heat and add the chopped chocolate and wait until melted. Once melted, whisk until smooth and glossy. Set the icing aside for about an hour, whisking every so often. Put the two cakes together with icing in the middle, around the sides and on top.

- Decorated items will be judged on the bake as well but higher scoring on decoration.

- Drinks – clear bottle with screw top, dated and clearly identified, free from bits and sediment.
