The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards MUST complement the theme and be neat and tidy.

The maximum display area for each competitor MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards MUST complement the theme and be neat and tidy.

At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

Exhibits to be composed of natural material, with or without accessories.

Exhibits to be viewed from the front.

NFYFC will follow the NAFAS Rules on the day of the Finals –This class is foam (oasis) free however eco-friendly and biodegradable alternatives can be used.

28 & Under

Exhibit Title: "Down Under" A front facing exhibit to the theme Down Under.

The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x**

optional height (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards MUST complement the theme and be neat and tidy.

NFYFC will follow the NAFAS Rules on the day of the Finals –This class is foam (oasis) free however eco-friendly and biodegradable alternatives can be used.

DISPLAY

A worktable will be provided close to the display area – approximately half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor.

Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation.

All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled in the hall. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than judges or stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors, will be allowed in the competing area.

At the NFYFC final, the NFYFC will provide a County Name and Number label for each display and workspace.

Competitors may use a battery-operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will no mains power supply available

Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the back board or base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the back board or base board will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit and should be within the size restrictions. The external side of the back board will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit.

Exhibits must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. Any entry removed before the Presentation of Awards will be disqualified.

All exhibits and competitors' property will be at the risk of the competitor and NFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained – therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

TIMING

Allowance of **one hour to include final checks and measurement of the exhibit**. Before leaving the competing area, competitors will be given a further 5 minutes to clear and tidy the work site.

Competitors may unpack their equipment and plant material/flowers onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session commences.

Competitors may set up their Eco-friendly flower arranging support material/mechanics in position prior to the one-hour practical session if required.

Competitors may set up their display bay before the one-hour practical session commences. *To enter please click the entry form link below and let your Club Secretary know you have entered*

NFYFC Tug of War - Mens - Ladies - Junior GENSB Team

Ladies and Men's teams shall consist of eight pulling members of the same gender. No more than two (2) members of a team may be between the ages of 15 and over, and under 17 years on 1 September 2023 and the remainder of the team **MUST** be between 17 years and over, and 28 years of age or under on 1 September 2024.

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A Junior GENSB team shall consist of between 7 and 10 pulling members, male or female, who must be between 12 years & 17 years of age and under on 1st September 2024. This means competitors MUST have attained their 12th birthday on 1st September 2024 and may be 18 on the day of the competition.

All competitors must be full members of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC **(You cannot compete for more than one club and county in one membership year)**. Competitors at the National Final must both present their YFC membership card and also, if over 18, have additional official photographic ID (Passport or Driving Licence).

Coaches and Trainers – Only one Coach is permitted with each team during pulling. Only one Trainer or "Water-Carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the Trainer shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during actual pulling. Neither the Coach nor Trainer need comply with other rules of eligibility.

On the day of the NFYFC Final members are only allowed to pull and compete in one age or gender category.

To enter a Club Team please let your Club Secretary know you are interested for them to complete and return for the FULL Team. Each club can have 1 Male & Female Team and 2 Junior Teams

Car Rally Full Day Auto Test – (28 & under)

Competitors (the Club Team) to be 28 years of age or under on 1 September 2024 and a full member of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC. The person driving on the day must provide their FULL Driving Licence on booking in. The team can consist of either 2 Senior Members or 2 Inter Members (or mixed) or A Senior or Inter Member driving and a junior navigator.

Each Club can have a maximum of 2 teams.

The competition is to navigate through a marked course not hitting any of the circuit and being timed.

Morning Competitions

From 9.30 am – 12.30pm

1. Senior/Intermediate Tractor - Individual Competitors must be 17-28 years. Teams of two, the first competitor must manoeuvre a trailer through a course and unhitch. The Second competitor has to attach linkage implement and manoeuvre through course.to finish. The course will be designed by the judge and will not be judged on timing but skill. Judges results are final.

2. Junior Tractor – Individual Competitors must be 14 – 17 years and are required to negotiate a course set by the judge and will not be judged on timing but skill. Judges results are final.

3. ATV – Inter/Senior Team A team shall consist of two members, one shall be 21 years or under on the 1st of September 2024 and the other member shall be 28 years or under on the 1st September 2024. The course will be set by the judge and will not be judged on timing but skill. Judges results are final.

4. ATV – Junior Team a team shall consist of two Junior members, both must be aged between 14-17 years of age on the 1st of September 2024. The course will be set by the judge and will not be judged on timing but skill. Judges results are final.

5. Mini Digger Tyre - Open Individual for 14 & Above only – judged by quickest time to get 5 balls in a tyre/Bucket.

6. Wind up Ratchet strap – Open Individual Competitors must be 10 – 28 years. Judged by quickest time and the neatest.

7. Dress and Undress a farmer's outfit – Open Individual Judged by quickest time and preciseness of clothing.

8. How many Rich Tea Biscuits can you eat in a minute without water – Open Individual Competitors must be 10 – 28 years. Judged by quickest time.

9. Nail bashing – Open Individual Competitors must be 10 – 28 years. Judged by amount of hits in a certain time.

10. Welly Wanging – Open Individual Competitors must be 10 – 28 years. judged by furthest distance thrown.

11. Change a Double Duvet & Two Pillows – Open Individual Competitors must be 10-28 years. Judged by quickest time.

12. Splat the Rat – Open Individual Competitors must be 10-28 years. Judged by amount of times hit in 30 seconds

13. Hoopla – Open Individual Competitors must be 10-28 years. Judged by amount in within a certain amount of time.

- 100g (4oz) Butter, Softened
- 175g (6oz) Caster Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 2 Ripe Bananas, Mashed
- 225g (8oz) Self-Raising Flour
- 1 Teaspoon Baking Powder
- 2 Tablespoons Milk
- Gas Mark 4

Method

Lightly grease tin and line with non-stick baking parchment. Measure all the ingredients into a mixing bowl and beat for about 2 minutes, until well blended. Spoon the mixture into the tin and level the surface. Bake for about 1 hour until well risen and golden brown.

- 1 tbsp Cocoa Powder
- 2 tsp Baking Powder

- 250g/9oz Light Muscovado Sugar
- 200ml/ 1/3 pint Buttermilk
- 150ml/ ¼ pint Sunflower Oil
- 2 tsp Vanilla Extract
- 1 tbsp Red Food Colouring Gel
- 2 Large Eggs
 For the icina
- 250g/9oz Butter, Softened
- 2 tsp Vanilla Extract
- 300g/10.5oz lcing Sugar
- 250g/9oz Full-fat Mascarpone

Method

Grease tins and line with baking paper. Measure the flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda and sugar into a bowl and mix well. Mix the buttermilk, oil, vanilla, food colouring and 100ml of water in a jug. Add the eggs and whisk until smooth. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and mix until combined. Divide the mixture evenly between the two tins and level surfaces. Bake for about 25-30 mins. Cool in the tins for 10 mins, then leave to cool out of tins on a wire rack.

To make icing, place the soft butter and vanilla extract in a large bowl and sift in half the icing sugar. Mix until smooth. Sift in remaining icing sugar and mix again. Add the mascarpone to the bow and gently fold in. Assemble cake by spreading the icing between both layers, around the edge and on top.

- Uniformity (if more than one item)/evenness of bake
- Degree of bake- not too light/dark, top/sides not caught, good colour, no bubbles, no cooling rack marks, same size throughout.
- No soggy bottoms
- Flavouring/filling evenly distributed
- Decorated items will be judged on the bake as well but higher scoring on decoration.
- Flavour
- Drinks clear bottle with screw top, dated and clearly identified, free from bits and sediment.

Please note ALL items must be collected before the end of the day (5.00pm approx.), after this time the items will be destroyed.
